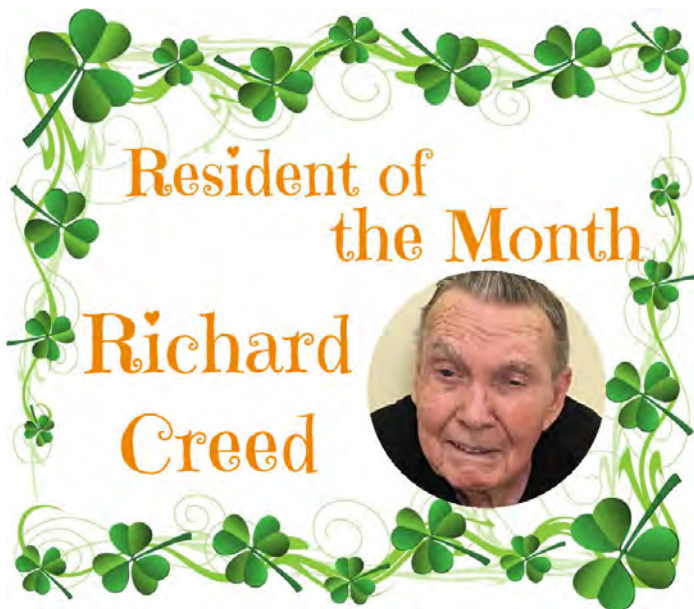

Friendly Helpful Reminders for Family Members

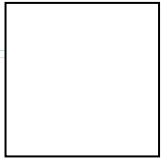
- ✓ When visiting, check all personal grooming items (bathing, oral care, shaving, etc.) to determine replenishment needs. Help us stay organized by marking **all** personal grooming and clothing items (socks, underwear, etc.) with your loved ones name.
- ✓ Always sign your loved one out/in when leaving the premises.
- ✓ Let us know of **any type** medical appointment (dental, eye, podiatry, etc.), whether we are providing transportation or not. This will assure that your loved one and the appropriate paperwork is ready to go when you arrive.
- ✓ When taking your loved one to an appointment, make sure that you have received communication paper work from the supervisor or medication technician. Upon return from the appointment, please remember to return the communication paperwork to a care staff member. This paperwork is used as a communication tool between our care team and the off-site physician.
- ✓ It is important to give all medications, including over-the-counter medications, to a care team member, so that he/she can process the medication according to our licensing regulations.
- ✓ Please don't hesitate to call us if we can assist you in any way ☺
