Premier Senior Living Visitation Policy/Procedure: NC

- All Visitors must be screened prior to entry including temperature taken by facility staff member. Any potential visitor with signs or symptoms of COVID-19, or who have had direct exposure to someone with COVID-19 in the previous 14-day period (regardless of vaccine status) will be denied entry.
 - Minors must exhibit ability to wear required PPE through the duration of visit. If they cannot meet this requirement visitation will be denied.
 - Hand Hygiene and proper PPE usage must be adhered to at all times during visit, including a face mask that covers the nose and mouth must be worn at all times during the visit. Visitors who are unable to adhere to the core principles of COVID-19 infection prevention shall not be allowed to visit and should be asked to leave. (Core principals of CMS/CDC Infection Control)
 - Social Distancing must be maintained at 6 feet at all times. If the resident is fully vaccinated, they can choose to have close contact (including touch) with their visitor while wearing a well-fitting face mask and performing hand hygiene before and after.
 - Visitors are to report to designated visitation location or residents' room and not be lingering in hallways or be in any other areas of the facility.
 - Visits of residents who share a room with another resident cannot be conducted in the resident room and must be conducted in the designated visitation area.
- Visiting hours must be clearly communicated and posted in a conspicuous place.
 - Scheduling of visits will only be required if space in facility does not lend itself to comply with social distancing. Visiting hours should end at 8PM to allow quiet time and not to disturb the residents sleep experience.
 - All frequently touched surfaces must be wiped down at frequent intervals with approved disinfectant. All designated visitation rooms shall be wiped down with approved disinfectant and a time period of no less than 15 minutes in between uses.
